## Board of Education

The seven members of the Board of Education have explored many new areas of educational opportunity during the 1965-66 school year. Along with this, the Board has been very busy with such regular activities as policy making, personnel approval, appropriations of budgets and expenditures, and a second curriculum study. Many extra meetings were held regarding special problems and the millage struggle.

Education is moving into many new areas of exploration and our Board is keeping Port Huron up to date with much of this. The opening of the Thomas A. Edison Elementary and Sparlingville Elementary Schools, programmed our district into the practices of team teaching and individualized instruction. The initiation of Project Headstart explored the need for offering culturally deprived children a chance for a better start in school. A citizen's study to effect possible reorganization of the Junior College was launched. Application for federal funds for home study centers and remedial instruction programs faced up to the need for helping educationally disadvantaged children.
